From the Editor's DESK



It's been a busy month for your editor resulting in this issue of "The Long Path" arriving late at the printing press.

I arrived at the Port Huron train station at 11:59 PM on Thursday, May 4th. Spent Friday recovering from sore butt train ride from Los Angeles which began Monday May 1st. My 2 week trip included the Visalia DX Convention, a visit with my friend Jess, AI9L in Kingman Arizona and a visit with my niece and her family in Burbank California.

VISALIA

It was nice to rekindle friendships idled by Covid. But many were a no show. However the convention had over 400 registrants. The Saturday evening banquet had well over 250 attending with Adrian, KO8SCA and Dave, WD5COV speaking re Bouvet Island, 3Y0J DXpedition. The exhibit hall was attended by FlexRadio, Yaesu and Elecraft. DX Engineering sponsored free drinks prior to the banquet on Saturday, as well as Friday. As far as I could observe, everyone had a good time!

I attended the DX Forum - chaired by Paul, N6PSE. A discussion was had re "What Now?". Most attendees have worked all 340 and looking for something to do. It was suggested that the ARRL DX Committee reduce the 350 kilometer possession limit for entities to ? Say 175 kilometers? Which would expand the DXCC entity list from 340 to a larger

value generating more DXpeditions, activity on the bands and rekindling our DX excitement which has been reduced to embers. It was suggested that we solicit our DXCC local representative (eg. SEMDXA's Stan, AC8W) to support the motion to reduce the mileage limit.

Another hot topic was the cost of future DXpeditions. Maybe the rules could be changed so that a GPS validation of location would enable operation from a ship near shore or docked at the rare DX rather than trying to land on an inhospitable rock eg Scarborough Reef or Bouvet Island?

Here's a picture of Don, N1DG and Adrian, KO8S-CA standing in front of a radio in a box (RIB) which

could be deployed on shore with antennas and operated remotely thus eliminating the need to build a base camp.

SEMDXA ELECTIONS

Yup. Its that exciting time of the year, when in June we elect our new executive for the 2023/2024 year.

The secretarial position has been vacant, with Chet VE3CFK standing in on an as needed basis over the last year. Consider stepping up and volunteering. If you cannot attend all the meetings, someone on the executive is willing to step in for you.

5Z - Kenya

Mark, VK3XB is QRV as 5Z4XB from Nairobi until May 8. Activity is on 160 to 6 meters using mainly FT8 and some SSB.

9X - Rwanda

Harald, DF2WO is QRV as 9X2AW until May 15. Activity is on 40 to 6 meters using CW and FT8. QSL via M0OXO.

DX0NE - Spratly Is.

4F2KWT, Gil will be on Spratly from April 30 to May 9 on 160-6M with 100 watts using a "horse fence" antenna for 160 and 80 along with SVDAs for the other bands. Gil will be solo with 2 radios. One operating FT8, the other on the other modessigning DX0NE

HK0 - San Andres

Operators PY8WW, PY7RP and PY7XC are QRV as HK0/home calls from San Andres, IOTA NA-033, until May 11. Activity is on 80 to 6 meters using CW, SSB, and FT8, with a focus on the higher bands and 6 meters. QSL to home calls.

VK9L - Lord Howe

Doug, VK9LF has been QRV on 10 meters using SSB around 0200z, and then on 20 meters using SSB after 0300z. QSL direct to home call.

RF Exposure

On May 3, 2021, new FCC rules governing RF exposure evaluations went into effect. While the exposure limits were not changed, the requirement to conduct an evaluation was made more broadly applicable to amateur licensees. A 2-year transition period was implemented to allow existing amateur licensees to conduct evaluations and make any changes necessary to ensure that their station complies with the exposure rules. On May 3, 2023, the transition period ended. All licensees must now conduct evaluations of their current station and reassess compliance when making changes to their stations that would affect exposure going forward.

The ARRL website features an RF Exposure landing page with resources, such as an RF exposure calculator, the entire RF Safety section from the 100th Edition of the ARRL The Handbook, a video explaining the topic, FAQs about the subject, and more. These tools and resources are available to the public without an <u>ARRL membership or website</u> account.

9Q - D.R. of Congo

The Italian DX Team have announced their plans to activate 9Q during the first half of September 2023. They will be operating as 9Q1AA on CW, SSB and RTTY while on FT8 they will be QRV as 9Q1ZZ

T31TT - Kanton Is






Isle of Rockall

The MM0UKI DXpedition to the Isle of Rockall is soon approaching. In just 1 month from now, several intrepid souls, including radio hams Nobby G0VJG and Emil DL8JJ, will attempt to land and stay on the islet. While the main intention is to break the current world record for time spent on Rockall, and to raise as much as possible for military / navy charities, the focus of this post is more to do with the radio side of the expedition:


Nobby will be the SSB & FT8 op while Emil will run CW & FT8. Bands to be used: 40-10m (2m possibly). Radios: 2 x FT-857D (100w), back-up KX2 (10w), 2 x Spiderbeam poles (10m), generator / solar panels, MFJ-902 tuner + logging software (N1MM+ / WinTest).


This will be only the third activation of Rockall – MS0IRC/P (2005), MM0RAI/P (2011) previously. Still under 11% of all IOTA chasers have Rockall confirmed, so demand will again be huge.
