Honda Portable Generators Recalled Due to Potential Fire Hazard

American Honda has announced that it is voluntarily recalling some 200,000 of its portable generators sold in the US due to a potential fire and burn hazard. The recall includes the EU2200i, EU2200i Companion, and EB2200i generators. The US Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) says the affected portable generators can leak gasoline from the fuel valve.

Users should stop operating the recalled generator and contact an authorized Honda dealer for a free repair. Honda is also contacting users directly. For more information, visit the CPSC website.

SEMDXA Shirts

The company we have been dealing with has changed their website and ordering protocol. So receiving shirts in time for HamVention is not possible. Further discussion will be had at the May meeting as to path forward for obtaining shirts.

VP8/0 - South Orkney Island

The upcoming planned operation has gotten a \$30,000 grant from the NCDXF, the Northern California DX Foundation, toward the \$325,000 estimated expedition cost. Joining the team is NG2H, a former US Navy submariner. He was on the 2016 VK0EK Heard Island operation. Also added is WD5COV, who has 351 in the DXCC mixed standings who has been on many DXpeditions to rare ones. Severe weather tents have been bought and the fundraising drive continues. So far donations have come from 19 clubs or foundations and 130 individuals. Expedition team members will be at the upcoming Dayton HamVention, Dallas Ham-Com, Ham Radio Friedrichshafen and the Pacific Northwest DX Conven-

DX IS!

Probably no DX station in history has been so thoroughly worked as Slim. Unfortunately, very few DXers can prove their QSO's with him, because Slim is a notoriously abominable QSLer.

You see, Slim is the generic name for phonies and bootleggers. He may take the call of a legitimate station and run up several hundred bogus QSO's, leaving the legitimate owner of the call sign to deal with the flood of QSLs. In his more creative form Slim simply makes up his call-sign, and, whether or not the chosen call-sign sounds believable, DXers will invariably pile-up to work him, ever hopeful that he will defy the odds and turn out to be true-blue.


How did these phonies get the name Slim? This name has been given in honor of an especially imaginative fellow who fired up as 8X8AA in the spring of 1968 giving his name as Slim and his QTH as Cray Island, "off the coast of Newfoundland". This slim was quite active for sometime during the summer, and he drew a respectable following. In fact, the station log at W5DV reveals a QSO with 8X8AA on May 30, 1968 at 1755Z, He sounded so reasonable that an "insurance" QSO did not seem necessary.

Imagine W5DV's disappointment to learn from Bob White, W1CW, at the 1968 ARRL Convention that the prefix 8X was assigned to India and that the Slim was simply another phoney! A lot of other DXers were similarly crushed. But as a tribute to the audacity and originality of this particular operation, DXers memorialized the fellow by giving his name to all pirates and phonies that followed.

The authors of "DX IS" first heard of this "honor" in the West Coast DX Bulletin, and whether its origin was a spontaneous creation on the DX bands or the work of WA6AUD, it is unknown.
