THE LONG PATH

RX antennas for Top Band

Top band, AKA 160M is a noisy band. Natural noise and man made noise plague this band challenging those of us that chase DX on this band to pursue LOW NOISE antennas.

One antenna that I have found affective is to use my HF beam, which is a Mosley PRO-57B (20, 27, 15,12,10M). Because it is not resonant on 160M, it does not peek the noise on 160M. Granted that the signal that you are trying to copy is weaker than would be the case with a resonant 160M antenna, but what is interesting is that the S/N ratio improves with the non resonant antenna. Try it out sometime. You will find that it also works on 80 and 40 and 30M as well. I came across this interesting web site from Top Band Reflector. It compares commercially available receive antennas as well as beverages and bogs for top band.

For those that like to chase weak signals on 160, 80 and 40M, this comparison will help you in finding a solution that fits your back yard. And now is the time to get ready for those long winter nights of chasing DX on 160M.

Hamvention 2019 Attendance

Approaches All-Time Peak

The Hamvention Executive Team announced on July 15 that attendance at Dayton Hamvention® 2019 was 32,472. This marks the highest attendance recorded since Hamvention moved in 2017 from Hara Arena to the Greene County Fairgrounds and Exposition Center in Xenia, Ohio. This year's attendance also approached an all-time Hamvention high. Attendance at the show peaked in 1993 at 33,669, before the 1996 change in date from April to May while Hamvention was still being held at Hara Arena. Last year, Hamvention welcomed 28,417 visitors in its second year in Xenia. Attendance in 2016 for the show's final year at Hara was 25,364.

Hamvention hosted the ARRL 2019 National Convention, and both embraced the theme of "Mentoring the Next Generation."

Hamvention officials suggested that a small factor behind the increased attendance could have been the free admission on Sunday. Sunday-only tickets accounted for some 800 of the total attendance. The open admission day was an effort to allow local non-hams to experience Hamvention, and free Sunday admission is expected to be continued next year, Hamvention officials said.

Amateur operators from all US states and territories and 60 other countries attended Dayton Hamvention 2019.

The world's largest Amateur Radio exposition, Dayton Hamvention is sponsored by the Dayton Amateur Radio Association (DARA) every third full weekend in May. Hamvention 2020 will take place on May 15, 16, and 17.

FT8/4 Banter

If you do not subscribe to Top Band Reflector, you might want to consider doing so. Although primarily focused on 160M discussions, they sometimes get sidetracked and chat about other stuff which is loosely connected with 160M. The last several posts have been about FT8, and it's ramifications on the HF bands. Here's one mans view (Jeff VY2ZM):

It is mid summer here and E season on 6M has been fun to play with while 160m is pretty S L O W as it usually is.

On these pages (Top Band Reflector pages) there has been a lot of chatter regarding FT8—(which

basically took over 6M DX'ing starting in July 2017 - all DX is now on 50.313 FT8 - which is why I had to adopt this mode in order to continue DX'ing on 6m). It was either do that or give up operating on 6M during E season.

I do hope that CW continues to thrive on Topband but this past season there was TONS of DX on FT8 and in my opinion LESS DX on CW than in prior years. It is quite possible to work in JA on 160m from here on FT8 with 100w out - which would have been quite rare indeed on CW as I recall (I do not think I ever worked JA with 100w from here but who knows?)

Today as I write this - I am listening to 28.074Mhz on a totally DEAD 10m band. If I tune the entire CW portion and the whole SSB portion, there is NOTHING - repeat NOTHING there - no signals whatsoever to be found. Yet on 28.074Mhz - I just worked a whole page of Europeans on FT8 - to my almost total INCREDULITY!!

I am not sure how I feel about all of this - but one thing is SURE - the DX world has changed - and there is no looking back.

I love CW on Topband and used to love CW on 6m - but that no longer exists -so I do hope the 6m migration to FT8 does not repeat itself on Topband! To all a good summer and CU on CW again starting in September.



Historic trans-Atlantic contact made on 144 MHz

A historic contact was made on Sunday the 16th June 2019 when the Atlantic was spanned for the first time on 144 MHz.


D41CV on Cape Verde Islands off the coast of Africa managed to work **FG80J** in Guadeloupe on 144.174 MHz using the FT8 digital mode. The distance was an incredible 3,867 kms.

To put that into context, the distance from the west coast of Ireland to Newfoundland is 3,000 kms.
