SEMDXA will host it's first online virtual meeting on Thursday October 8, 2020.



Below (in blue) is the "Join Zoom Meeting" link. Click on it.



You may be redirected, but you should ultimately end up with this screen.




Follow the instructions on the screen and you should end up with a "Video Preview" screen.

I hit the "Join without Video" button, because everybody already knows what I look like. If you have a WEB cam on your PC or laptop, you can "Join with Video". These choices only impact what other people see of you from your webcam. It does not impact what you see from the ZOOM event orchestrator or the other participants. (so make sure you have clothes on if you are using your web cam!). No need to wear your medical mask for the ZOOM meeting since it is a virtual meeting.




SEMDXA ONLINE VIRTUAL MEETING (cont'd)

The True Blue DXers Club announces BANDS ALIVE The 2021 CW/SSB Ultra-Marathon

As the new solar cycle is now under way and conditions on the HF bands are expected to gradually improve throughout 2021, this unprecedented initiative is launched to give DXers a further motivation to get on the air and therefore support, improve and promote amateur activity using person-to-person modes of communication such as CW and SSB. This initiative, which we call "ultra-marathon" for a reason, is indeed unprecedented – its aim, reflected in its format, is to get people on the air and make as many unique contacts as possible over the duration of a full year, and not simply to work as many countries as possible. JX - Jan Mayen

LA7DFA, ex-JX7DFA, Per-Einar, says LA2US's, Erik's, flight to the Jan Mayen is October 1. A weather delay is always a possibility. When Erik arrives he will first focus on settling in so do not expect much activity right away. He will have the JX2US callsign on through the winter season there. Erik plans to be on CW, FT8 and maybe some other modes, focusing on 160, 80, 40 and 30. QSL JX2US via LA2US.

Chinese "Foghorn"

The Chinese "Foghorn" over-the-horizon radar (OTH-R) is once again showing up in the logs of the International Amateur Radio Union Monitoring Service (IARUMS) in IARU Region 1 (Europe, the Middle East, and Africa). While the reports reflect what's being heard by stations primarily in Europe, the same interference can and does affect other parts of the world, often depending upon the time of day. Named by former IAR-UMS Region 1 Coordinator Wolf Hadel, DK2OM, because of its sound, the Foghorn was first reported in 2017 operating in amateur bands. The signal is frequency modulation on pulse (FMOP) with 66.66 sweeps-per-second bursts.

TM82ALC

TM82ALC will be active during October to commemorate the 290th anniversary of the death in 1730 of Antoine de Lamothe-Cadillac, founder of the City of Detroit, Michigan, event sponsors say. He also once served as the governor of Louisiana. The Detroit Automobile Company was renamed the Cadillac Automobile Company in his honor and adopted the Lamothe-Cadillac coat of arms as its product logo.

JW - Svalbard

Provided the Covid situation allows them to travel LA6VM, Erling; LA9DL, Just; and LA7XK, Halvard; will be heading to Longyearbyen, Svalbard to operate as JW6VM, JW9DL and JW7XK respectively between October 7 and 12. Plans are for JW9DL and JW6VM to operate on HF, while JW7XK will be on the satellites, mostly RS-44.

HC - Ecuador

Promoting the biodiversity of Ecuador members of the HC DX Group will be operating special event station HD1X from the tropical rainforest Chocó eco-region (Grid FI09iv) from 1700Z on October 31 until 1700Z on November 3rd. Activity will be on HF, including the WARC-79 bands, on SSB, SSTV, FT4 and FT8 as well as VHF and UHF using FM and SSB on the satellites. QSL via EC5R.

VQ9 - Chagos Is.

WT3A (DU7ET), Bob, was able to get off the ship he has been working on for the past two weeks. He has secured his new license – VQ9T. In the past Bob has operated as VQ9ET, last QRV in June of 2015. This new callsign (VQ9T) is a reissued callsign, which was last used by N1TO, Ed, during 2001 and 2002. Bob is currently under a two week quarantine. He is expected to be in the Chagos Islands area for the coming months.

YI - Iraq

After operating during the week of September 7th as YI/IU5HWS, Giorgio, has now received an official callsign YI9WS thanks to the support of the Iraq Amateur Radio Society members YI1WL, YI3WHR and YI1SA. The YI9WS callsign is issued by Iraqi's National Communications and Media Commission (CMC). In order to operate legally from Iraq one must have approval from both the National Communications and Media Commission (CMC) and the Iraqi Amateur Radio Society (IARS). If you worked YI/IU5HWS during the week of September 7th it would behoove you to work him again with this new callsign.

W8UVZ Retires

Al Bailey, K8SIX has been in contact with George W8UVZ who has indicated that he is retiring from the Amateur Radio hobby for medical reasons.

As most of you know he is the Michigan 160 meter guru and maintained a huge station on his remote farm. He currently has over 3060 band countries and 320 countries confirmed on 160.


WSJT-X

WSJT-X is getting a new mode in the just-published release candidate version 2.3.0: FST-4. This mode is intended as a replacement for JT9 and WSPR. Based on a 4-GFSK modulation scheme, FST4 has some "knobs" that can be turned: selectable transmission length and different sub-mode tone spacings. Designations of the particular mode and settings for communicating with potential QSO partners will be in the form of FST4{W}-{Transmission Length \ {Submode \} - Examples: FST4W-120A, -300A, -900A, -1800A for WSPR-like modes, or FST4-15A, FST4-30B, FST4-30C, FST4-30D for 15 second A, 30 second B, C, and D modes. WSJT-X version 2.3.0rc1 is available for download now from the WSJT-X webpage. Mac users of WSJT-X version 2.3.0rc1: You will receive an error message at startup unless you change your system configuration for shared memory. See this article for more information and the changes that are necessary.
