SEMDXA will host it's first online virtual meeting on Thursday October 8, 2020.



Below (in blue) is the "Join Zoom Meeting" link. Click on it.



You may be redirected, but you should ultimately end up with this screen.




Follow the instructions on the screen and you should end up with a "Video Preview" screen.

I hit the "Join without Video" button, because everybody already knows what I look like. If you have a WEB cam on your PC or laptop, you can "Join with Video". These choices only impact what other people see of you from your webcam. It does not impact what you see from the ZOOM event orchestrator or the other participants. (so make sure you have clothes on if you are using your web cam!). No need to wear your medical mask for the ZOOM meeting since it is a virtual meeting.




SEMDXA ONLINE VIRTUAL MEETING (cont'd)

9G5FI by DL2RMC, Tom (aka HZ1FI, SU9TH, V31FI and other callsigns), says after his HZ and SU visits he is now in Accra, Ghana doing vocational training, currently the "Ghana Skills Development Initiative," a project which goes through September, 2022. He expects to be there for at least the next year. He is on all bands and CW, SSB and FT8.

JX - Jan Mayen

LA2US arrived October 1, to stay for the winter. He will be QRV as JX2US until March, operating on CW, FT8 and possibly other modes. He plans to emphasize 160, 80, 40 and 30M.

HS - Thailand

Callsign HS10A has been given to Thailand's King Vajiralongkorn, an advanced class license. This happened in Amphon Hall in Dusit Palace on September 24.

7Q - Malawi

Z81B is the callsign that IZ0EGB, Massimo, has, as he continues to work from the border area, SSB on 40 and 20 from time to time. He is assigned there until December.

Cycle 25

Highly regarded solar physicist Leif Svalgaard of the W. W. Hansen Experimental Physics Laboratory at Stanford University gives his <u>prediction</u> on solar cycle 25 forecasting a smoothed sunspot number of 128 +/- 10.

This is on average with 6 other predictions, except for one where it was predicted that Cycle 25 will be better than any ever experienced by ham radio operators since the birth of Amateur Radio.

ARRL Multi-op

Did you see the article "Guidelines Issued for ARRL DX Contest Multioperator Stations" on the ARRL website? The COVID-19-related accommodations for 2021 provide opportunities for groups of hams to cooperatively use their own stations to enter one of the multi-operator classes. See the ARRL website article for the details.

Something to be aware of: Some state QSO parties prohibit the remote operation of in-state stations. As always, it pays to check the rules of the contest before operating in it.

Biography of our Thursday night guest speaker - Lance Collister, W7GJ

Lance Collister currently holds Amateur Extra Class license callsign W7GJ. On September 21, 2016, he celebrated his 50 year anniversary of being a licensed amateur radio operator.

Lance received his first ham radio license WN3GPL in 1965 at the age of fourteen. His first contact was in Lancaster, PA on 2m AM with a Heathkit Twoer. From that first contact, he was hooked on VHF DXing and soon became active on 2m meteor scattter and aurora. While earning bachelor degrees in Physics and Religion, he helped form the Middlebury College Amateur Radio Club. He copied his first 2m EME signal in 1974, and wrote his first moontracking computer program that same year. As WA1JXN in Vermont, he completed his first 2m EME contact by working W6PO on March 17,1978. The following year, he moved to Frenchtown, Montana and on December 1, 1983, he gained notoriety in the worldwide amateur radio community by being the first civilian to contact space, using his 2m EME array to complete a 2m contact with astronaut W5LFL aboard STS-9. He also took first place worldwide on 2m in the ARRL International EME Competition that same year. In the early 1980's, he was active on the Board of Directors of the CSVHFS and helped develop and promote the Maidenhead grid awards that later became the ARRL VUCC program. In September 1999, he achieved 2m DXCC #11, by CW on EME. He made four CW 2m EME DXpeditions to C6 (The Bahamas) and two to ZF (Cayman Islands).

In 1996, he upgraded to Amateur Extra class and obtained the callsign of W7GJ. He constructed his first 6m antenna and amplifier. Later that year, he completed his first 6m EME contact by working SM7BAE on CW. He achieved 6m DXCC #815 in 2005. With the advent of the digital transmission mode of JT65A and expansion of his 6m EME antenna to four nine element yagis, he has completed contacts with 221 countries on 6m, 165 of which were made via 6m EME. He has published numerous articles and guidelines and written computer programs to assist operators around the world in successfully operating EME, and has given many people their first 6m EME contact. In 2011, he was awarded the Jersey Trophy by UKSMG for his work in helping people get on 6m and for his tireless promotional efforts regarding 6m EME. In 2016, he was honored by the CSVHFS with the Mel.S. Wilson W3BOC Award "For Continuous Service & Dedication Towards Promoting VHF & UHF Amateur Radio Activity".

He retired for medical reasons in 2007, and since then has made 6m EME DXpeditions to E51 (The South Cook Islands), 3D2 (Fiji), 5W (Samoa), E6 (Niue), TX5K (Clipperton Island), KH8 (American Samoa), V6 (Micronesia) twice, T8 (Palau), VK9C (Cocos/Keeling), VK9X (Christmas Island), C2 (Nauru), CP (Bolivia) and S79 (Seychelles). In fall of 2021 he is planning to activate FO/A (Austral Islands) and FO/M (Marquesa Islands) in French Polynesia. He is credited by the American Radio Relay League with completing fourteen 6m "firsts" from the USA to new DXCC. On his birthday in 2015, he completed a 6m EME contact with KB3SII and K1WHS in FN67, and received the seventh FFMA award issued. Lance has demonstrated the ability to keep up with technical developments and successfully use new modes to capitalize on the propagation opportunities available on 6m. Much information about his 6m weak signal work - as well as his previous trips to activate rare countries for the first time on 6m EME, and his free *GJTRACKER* moon tracking program – are available on his web site.

In addition to his amateur radio activities, Lance enjoys singing bass in various choirs. He toured with the Middlebury College Choir, has sung with the Missoula Symphony Chorale for over three decades, and participated in Eric Whitacre's Virtual Choirs 3,4,5 and 6 He also was accepted to sing in Disney's World of Color Honor Choir, which was a virtual choir opening Disney's World of Color program at Disney World. Lance also sang with Eric Whitacre at Lincoln Center in New York City at the end of March, 2014, and at Carnegie Hall in April 2018. He serves on the Board of Directors for the International Choral Festival, which brings choirs from all over the world to Missoula, Montana every 3 years. He also sings in his church choir at Holy Spirit Episcopal church in Missoula, Montana. Lance married Judge Karen A. Orzech in 1996, and has one daughter, Brittany, who is married with 2 young daughters of her own.

SEMDXA MOST WANTED


Here are the results of the SEMDXA Most Wanted survey compiled by Larry, K8UT. Thank you Larry for orchestrating the survey.

Time is running like crazy, also Antarctic summer will not wait for us so long... Please keep in mind that we will maybe need to reschedule this trip for the next season.

In the meantime Dom 3Z9DX received his Fijian government travel permit to go back to the Pacific Rebel Base as a back up plan. There is three different DXCC's around: 3D2/C Conway, 3D2/R Rotuma, 3D2 Fiji + several IOTAs including some very rare groups. Unfortunately, cyclone season starts from November to March... so all looks very difficult and hard from logistic point of view. Let's see what happens soon. (News update by Rebel DX Group)

VU7 – Lakshadweep Islands

After reading the August 2020 How's DX column in QST Magazine and learning newly licensed Amateur Radio operator VU3EBX, Aboobaker Kunhi Badayi, who lives on Kavaratti Island, Lakshadweep Island, did not have an HF radio KB1DJ, Alan Kline decided to do something about that. Aboobaker is the only licensed Amateur Radio operator in the number 55 Most Wanted List, per Club Log. He was licensed in April 2018. Up until now he has been operating on VHF working into the VU2GCC repeater in Kerala on mainland India, some 470 kilometers away. VU2JOS, Mr. Jose, has an excellent article which ran in a recent issue of Telangana Today. I'd like to publicly thank Alan and Jose for helping Aboobaker. True Ham Spirit!

ZLs and 60M

New Zealand Radio Amateurs Lose Access to 60 Meters


Radio amateurs in New Zealand no longer have access to 60 meters, effective October 24.
Use of the band by radio amateurs in New Zealand is provisional, allowing hams there to use two frequencies in the band as part of a "trial."

The New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) advised it was not willing to approve another renewal of the 5 MHz trial allocation. As in the US, the federal government and military are primary on the 5 MHz band. According to NZART, the decision was not made lightly by NZDF, but access to that part of the HF spectrum is very important to support NZDF's new platforms, tactical radio equipment, and updated HF site equipment in the delivery chain.

VP8 - S. Shetland Is.

The Worldwide Antarctic Program reports that DS4NMJ is heading to King Sejong Station on the big southern continent. Op Lee Sang-hoon has completed 15 days of self-isolation and has the opportunity to go back to the station on Antarctica aboard the ARAON Korean icebreaker ship. Embarkation was October 31 with a stop at Jangbogo Station "for a while," then on to King Sejong Station, arriving there about January 15th. This will be his sixth time on Antarctica. King Sejong Station is on the coast at Maxwell Bay, with King George Island and Nelson Island, the South Shetland Islands, nearby. King Sejong Station was established in 1988 as a year-round station, typically with an over-wintering staff of 17 or so. In Antarctic summer there are about 100 international researchers and scientists there.
