We will continue to monitor the situation as it unfolds. JD1/O - OGASAWARA

JH3QFL, Takio, tells us he plans to operate JD1BQA from Chichisima (AS-031) from May 1-7. He will have an FTdx101MP, IC-7300 and FT-857D running 200 watts into a groundplane, dipole and Yagi. He will be capable of running FT8 on 1.8 through 50 MHz. Seems he may concentrate on FT8 and FT4 on 160, 80, 40 and 6 Meters. He will do some CW on the RS-44 satellite.

VK9/W & VK9/M Willis & Mellish Reef

The Hellenic Amateur Radio Association of Australia October 2021 DXpeditions to Willis Island and Mellish Reef. VK3YP, John, says the callsigns VK9HR are expected to be renewed in August and "VK9IR will be an additional callsign to be allocated". The most important document is the landing permit, which comes from Parks Australia. A permit is not "required to visit these coral sea islands for non-commercial purposes but a permit application is required to setup a camp site and to stay overnight on the island". The seven operator team plan to use verticals on 160, 80, 40 and 30 Meters, while VDAs will be used on 20, 17, 15, 12 and 10 Meters. Activity is expected on SSB, CW and FT8 on 1.8 through 28 MHz. They expect to have two Kenwood TS-590S and two Icom IC-7300 with all SPE amplifiers.

3A - Monaco

There is a new ham in Monaco - 3A2OC, Blaise. He has a Yaesu FTDX-3000 to a long wire and a vertical.



8J - Antarctica

The Japanese Antarctica Research Expedition (JARL) station 8J1RL will continue to be QRV from February 2021 to January 2022 with operator JG3PLH, Takumi, at the helm. This Antarctic station is located at the Japanese Syowa Station East Ongle Island, Lutzow-holm Bay, Dronning Maud Land (AN-015). At the station are an IC-7610 and IC-7300 capable of running 50 watts into a 4 element Yagi (20/15/10 Meters), 3 Element Yagi (30/17/12 Meters) and Wire (40 Meters).

ZD8 - Ascension Is.

TA1HZ, Tevfik passed quarantine and is now on the air as ZD8HZ on 20 and 17 meters FT8. Due to his work schedule, Monday through Saturday, he can only operate after 1900Z.



KH9 - Wake Is.

NL7RR, Thomas, is planning to be back on Wake Island starting in mid-February 2021. He was last there and QRV as NL7RR/KH9 in October of last year. During that trip he was active on both 40 and 20 meters SSB operating for three days for several hours making about 75 contacts. This time he will be there for 90 days. Once on the island and set up Thomas will post suggested "bands and frequency's and UTC times". QSL via AL7JX.

A2 - Botswana

Dave Johnson, VE7VR's Botswana trip was planned for 2020 but was postponed 1 year due to covid-19. He is hoping that was enough time. All flights, vehicle and overnight stays have been confirmed so unless this comes off the rails again, we should be on the way April 28-May 24, 2021. This will be my 3rd trip to Botswana. I lived there for 9 months in 1972 and was on the air using A2CEW. In 2018, my wife and I returned, and I was on the air in a limited way as A25VR. Propagation was so bad I only managed 96 Qs in 6 days of trying. This year we will be back for a 3 week self-driving 4X4 camping safari. Each day I will set up camp, which will include inverted vees and IC-7100.

5V - Togo

Daniel Eberil, HB9EHD has his equipment packed, the visas obtained and the callsign granted (5VDE). All is ready for our next mini-DX adventure to Togo/Africa from February 11 to February 20. After clearing customs in the capital Lome, making a second COVID Test at arrival, followed by a 24h guarantine, we will drive 7h north by jeep to Kara, w[h]ere we will set up our QTH. This will be just a little north of the famous historic telegraphy station KAMINA from 1914 The rise and death of this German communication outpost could serve as a script for an intense spy movie (more on Wikipedia). Daniel (HB9EHD) and Dominik will support the doctors at the university hospital in Kara and use their spare time to put Togo on the ham map. The team will put up wire antennas and sat dishes. The overall goal is to use the open 40m and 20m bands for FT-8 and QO-100 for SSB. For FT-8 we will bring an Yaesu 991-a and an EFHW running 100W. Without too much QRM this should work fine on 40m after sunset. We will not use Fox/Hound mode. For QO-100 a 40cm camping dish with an Adalm-Pluto is used. This setup was already field tested and works fine. While our signal is always fairly strong, there might be a limitation in hearing other QRP stations. So please use your larger sat dishes to contact us. We will be working just below the middle beacon, maybe in split mode. Please keep in mind that any travel during COVID pandemic brings uncertainty. We will do our best to be on the air as often as time permits. All OSOs will be confirmed by LoTW and eQSL. Specially printed QSL-Cards are available via HB9EHD (2USD and SA-Envelope). See QRZ.com for details. Looking forward to a friendly OSO with all of you.

3A - Monaco

F4FRL, Mireille; and F5RBB, Patrick, will sign 3A/F4FRL and 3A/F5RBB when there, February 24 to March 2. Look for them on 40 and SSB and digital modes. QSL—LOTW or eQSL.

What's the Time?

Things might just get a little challenging for UTC -Coordinated Universal Time, that is - the timekeeping system so familiar to us hams who pursue precision in our DX contacts or use some of the newer digital modes. Scientists are now suggesting that the world's atomic clocks, which control UTC, shorten the minute so that UTC can better keep pace with the irregular rate of the Earth's rotation, which most people measure using the less precise method known as "solar time."

When the Earth's rotation was seen to be slowing, scientists added something called a "leap second" to the end of a particular year. They've done this 27 times since 1972 to keep atomic clocks and UTC sympatico with solar time. Scientists believe Earth's 24-hour rotation has grown swifter now, making the days ever-so-slightly shorter. They also believe 2021 could well be the shortest year we've had in many decades. They say this will ultimately have an impact on navigation systems and satellite communications and anything else that requires precision in cosmic timekeeping.

This very subject is up for discussion at the World Radiocommunication Conference in 2023 which is at least two years - and many, many, many, many seconds away.



Jim Brown, K9YC writes: Hearing "doctors" who sell hearing aids get a 100% commission for what they sell, doubling the cost to the buyer. When my XYL was looking for aids, several ham friends who also happen to be engineers, recommended Costco. I went with her to the appointment to check her hearing and prescribe aids, and I took the same evaluation as she did. I was also present when they "tuned" the aids she bought a few weeks later. As an audio professional, I had to learn a lot about human hearing, and I was VERY impressed with every aspect of the process. They used excellent instrumentation, and the people doing it knew what they were doing. AND -- Costco sells top quality aids without the 100% markup, so the cost is half of what we would pay to an audiologist's office.

Editors Note: I'm not endorsing Costco. I just found Jim's comments interesting.

Helpful ZOOM Hint

ZOOM can sometimes be a noisy environment. Especially if everyone has their microphone turned on. To help the attendies better hear the presentation or speaker, please mute your microphone. The push-to-talk feature allows you to remain muted throughout your Zoom meeting and hold down the spacebar when you want to be unmuted and talk. In the Zoom Desktop Client, click your profile picture then click Settings. Click the Audio tab. Check the option Press and hold SPACE key to temporarily unmute yourself. This setting is now enabled.
