But there is DX out there. Just have to be lucky and have some magic in your pocket.




Termination Event

Something big may be about to happen on the sun. "We call it the Termination Event," says Scott McIntosh, a solar physicist at the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR), "and it's very, very close to happening."

It's a relatively new idea in solar physics championed by McIntosh and colleague Bob Leamon of the University of Maryland. According to the two scientists, vast bands of magnetism are drifting across the surface of the sun. When oppositely charged bands collide at the equator, they annihilate or "terminate". There's no explosion; this is magnetism, not anti-matter. Nevertheless, the Termination Event is a big deal. It can kickstart the next solar cycle into a higher gear.

6M Comments from The Daily DX

K9CT, Craig in Illinois, with a pair of nine-element InnovAntennas at112' and 141' and PGXL amplifier, 1,200 watts, says Friday morning was amazing, with "magic everywhere." His 6M DXCC total went from 128 to141 and his DXCC Challenge number went from 2996 to 3009, with 3,000 quickly confirmed on LOTW. Says Craig, "Finally made it to the 3000 club!" His new ones were: 40, 9K, A7, A9, E7, GJ, HZ, LX, OE, OL, OM, YU and Z3. He missed working 7X, HB0 and OD.

AA3CV, Jim, said "JA galore!" Starting at 2129Z July 2 and ending at 0008 for him July 3, he worked 80 JAs on 6M FT8. He says "The whole WSJT screen was nothing but JA and each time I was working one 2-3 more were calling! The whole thing was insane! Great fun!"

W3LPL, Frank says "This was an excellent JA-to-Maryland polar Es opening, but there is much more QRM than last year with the growing popularity of FT8. Today I completed 50 JA QSOs from 2144 to 2359Z."

W3LPL summarized, "We still have about four weeks of excellent sporadic-E DX ahead of us. By the end of July the seasonal wind shears in the sporadic-E region that make 6 meter DXing so enjoyable will become less intense and less frequent until the global occurrence of wind shears in the sporadic-E region become very infrequent and then vanish almost completely by late August."

Editors note: Several SEMDXA club members experienced "magical" DX days on 6M in early July. Fred, W1SKU worked 14 new ones on July 1st. Your editor worked 5 new ones the same day.

R0FK/POLE – North Pole Expedition

The famous Russian traveller, writer, artist and archpriest of the Russian Orthodox Church of the Moscow Patriarchate, Fyodor Konyukhov R0FK will join a Poseidon Expedition and set off to the top of the Earth on the world's largest and most powerful icebreaker – 50 Let Pobedy (50 years of Victory).

This is already Fedor's fourth expedition to the North Pole, but this time it will be special. The icebreaker will set sail on July 11, 2021 from Murmansk. Having reached the northernmost point of the planet, together with the Poseidon Expeditions team, he will set up camp, equip a mini-polar station, where he will remain to study the intensity of ice melting and their drift routes as well as conducting and analyzing the presence of micro-plastics at the North Pole.

He will QRV on air as R0FK/POLE on 20m using an FT-450 transceiver, 100 W, 12 volt battery, solar panels and GP antenna. Activity will be daily (from the moment of landing on drifting ice) at 04:00 UTC in the area of 14333 +/- kHz. For skeds, contact the RA5G Club Station (op: R3GM) who will form a list of callsigns for short contacts with R0FK/POLE.


