New FT-8 Software

The S9OK DXpedition team have not been operating FT8 in Fox and Hound but rather they are using MSHV software which allows several, up to 5 simultaneous streams of QSOs. When using the MSHV software it "looks like F/H to the eye but does not fully behave like it" Jim said. Also he notes the "caller's TX frequency does not move but stays where it started. KY7M, Lee, notes S9OK is "monitoring from 200 - 3000 outside of their multistreaming QRGs". The new approach "seems to be working for them quite well". Financial Support Request for 3Y0J Bouvet Island DXpedition November





GREETINGS:

We are a team of 11 international amateur radio operators who, in November 2022, will be sailing to, and operating from, Bouvet Island with the goal of making at least 120K QSOs.

The purpose of this letter is to ask for your financial support to get this rare DX entity in the logs of many amateur operators around the world.

Bouvet Island is a small Norwegian inactive volcanic island, half the size of Manhattan, covered almost entirely by snow and ice. Because of its remoteness, it has rightfully gained the title of the most remote uninhabited island on Earth. Bouvet Island is listed in the ClubLog DXCC at position #2, making it, for the ham radio world, the equivalent of the Mount Everest of the DXCC entities.

Our DXpedition, with the callsign 3Y0J, will start its journey in the Falkland Islands, and we anticipate sailing for 12 days through the treacherous waters of the South Atlantic Ocean before setting up camp, and operating from, Bouvet Island for 14-18 days. At the conclusion of our DXpedition, we will then sail another 12 days to the end point of the DXpedition: Cape Town, South Africa

Our goal is to set up and operate simultaneously from 8 stations, with full legal power (1500W), on 10M through 160M including 60M in CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8, but our main focus will be on the "human" modes.

The preparations for this complex endeavor are well underway. The 3 Norwegian co-leaders together with the team members have been working tirelessly for the past 2 years with the Norwegian Polar Institute as well as with experts and consultants who have already visited Bouvet Island or are knowledgeable about overcoming the difficulties of getting to, landing on, setting up camp and operating from Bouvet Island, an island battered by over 300 storms a year and by winds that often reach 100 miles an hour.

We are very close to raising the necessary funds to cover our estimated budget of \$650,000, which will make 3Y0J the most expensive DXpedition ever. The vast majority of these funds will be used to cover the expense of our chartered boat, the 101-foot Oceanic Ketch, named Marama, which will take us to and from Bouvet Island. Each 3Y0J team member is contributing \$20,000 toward this budget.

NCDXF (Northern California DX Foundation) and INDEXA (International DX Association) have already showed their amazing support to our project and made their largest donations ever, totaling \$115,000. Many other organizations and clubs around the world have followed suit, and we hope your club will be able to contribute as well. Your support would be highly appreciated.

C5 - The Gambia

C5C from Kololi will be October 24 to November 19, maybe longer. Operator F5NVF, Gerard, will be on 60-10M CW and SSB with his IC-7000. F5RAV, M0NPT, and 6W7RV will join later and bring along an IC-705 and an Expert 1.3 amp. They will be on CW, SSB, FT8 and the QO-100 satellite. They will be there October 28 to November 8 and be a team in the CQWW DX SSB weekend October 30-31.

C9 - Mozambique

IV3FSG, YL Elvira, plans to have C92R on the air sometime in October, spare time, 80-10M SSB and digital.

LX - Luxembourg

LX5MF commemorates the birth of Michael Faraday, which was September 22, 1791. LX5MF went on the air yesterday and goes to March 26, 2022, with the Luxembourg Science Center cooperating in the activity. Every QSO will get a bureau card, but you may QSL direct to LX1KQ.

D2 - Angola

Mikalai, UT6UY is QRV as D2UY from Cabinda for a few months. Activity is on 20, 15, and 10 M.

Bad News from Laos

XW0LP, Simon Luttrell reports that ham radio activity as of October 1st, 2021 ham radio will not be allowed to operate on ham bands which are not the primary users. Hence operations on the 472 kHz, 80, 60, 30, 6 M bands no longer permitted.

5H - Tanzania

Maurizio, IK2GZU is QRV as 5H3MB until November 20. Activity is on the HF bands using CW, SSB, and various digital modes.

HC8 - Galapagos Is.

Members of the Tifariti Gang are planning to put on another DX Friends DXpedition. They are heading to the Galapagos Islands where they will be QRV as HD8R from October 26 to November 7. Plans are to be active on CW, SSB, and digital modes with at least four stations. They will have four SPE Expert 1.5K-FA and one SPE Expert 1.3K-FA. Antennas for their 1.8 through 50 MHz operation, including 5 MHz, will be three 5 band Spiderbeams, a vertical for 30, 40, 60, 80 and 160 meters, a 28 foot boom 6 Meter Yagi, an Arrow SAT antenna and two Beverages.

IARU Reorganizes Digital Mode

Over the past 18 months a proposal for an IARU HF Digital Mode reorganization has been undertaken by representatives of all three IARU Regions

IARU-R1 reports: The objectives were to review the data modes usage of the Amateur Radio HF spectrum and propose changes that:

• Reduce inter-mode conflict between dissimilar operating modes; and • Facilitate the expansion of new technologies.

In conducting the review it was realized that it was necessary to update the manner in which the IARU creates its band plans. Accordingly, the IARU's band planning definition toolkit were redefined, and additional data mode definition characteristics has been added to help separate activities that are fundamentally incompatible within the data mode family.

With the band planning process updated, the proposal then revised the band plans of all three IARU Regions, focusing on the data sub-bands and taking into consideration:

• Popularity and capacity requirements; and • Existing band users and inter-mode compatibility assessments.

The team also took the opportunity to harmonize the band plans of all three IARU Regions to the greatest extent possible of course.

The proposal is now being discussed in the relevant committees.

SV/A - Mount Athos



3B9 - Rodrigues Is.


3B9FR, Robert, is again active after being inactive for over two years, as of September 21. He has been worked on 20, 15 and 17 CW.
