A state of emergency was declared in Ukraine just prior to the Russian military invasion. Among other things, the February 24 decree from President Volodymyr Zelensky will remain in effect for at least 30 days and may be extended. The state of emergency includes "a ban of amateur radio transmissions".

As per Ukrainian presidential office request, we will be removing the Ukrainian callsigns from the DX Summit.

DX Summit wants to avoid being an advertising medium for war and war related messages of any kind. As a result, we see it reasonable to block out all cluster posted messages related to this unfortunate event.

In addition, as of this moment, we are also blocking callsigns and messages posted by hams from the invading countries and regions such as Russia, Belarus and Donetsk (D1).

Editors note: If you haven't discovered "DX Summit" before, it is an excellent DX webpage with all kinds of relevant DX information and tools. One tool I find very useful is their "Spot Search" tool that allows one to search a particular call sign to see when that particular station has been on the air.

From the Hamvention Team:

"We strongly anticipate that the Hamvention 2022 is a go. We cannot guarantee what government may decide about unknown changes in the pandemic. It has become obvious that the State of Ohio is very unlikely to call a halt to large gatherings anytime soon. Despite a recent large spike in Omicron COVID cases and hospitalizations, there is no move to restrict large indoor or outdoor events such as sports events."

UR - Ukraine

Amateur radio has been suspended for 30 days by Ukraine's government, under a declaration of emergency, part of a decree from President Zelensky. This is not the first time amateur radio has been banned since World War II; it was temporarily banned in Poland during martial law in late 1981. From various reports and sources, it appears an exception is made for eastern Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts because those two already have special legal status because of Russia's occupation since 2014. Various other parts of the decree set up a new system for entry and exit to and from Ukraine, restriction on the movement of vehicles and their inspections, a ban on mass events and strikes, a curfew if necessary, document checks and other measures. The US Postal service reports that: "Ukraine Post advises that due to the conflict in the region international postal transit through Ukrainian territory has been suspended until further notice. Post offices will remain closed beginning February 24 and postal deliveries are suspended until further notice. As soon as the situation allows, the post will resume delivery of all international postal items." Stations from Ukraine with the letter I after the number in the prefix are located in this region and can theoretically be active as well their counterparts the D1 and D0 stations, who lean towards Russia. It should also be noted IARU Region I is suggesting not to spot Ukraine stations...



Cycle 25

THE TERMINATION EVENT HAS ARRIVED: Something big just happened on the sun on. Solar physicists Scott McIntosh (NCAR) and Bob Leamon (U. Maryland-Baltimore County) call it "The Termination Event"

"Old Solar Cycle 24 has finally died--it was terminated!" says McIntosh. "Now the new solar cycle, Solar Cycle 25, can really take off."

The "Termination Event" is a new idea in solar physics, outlined by McIntosh and Leamon in a December 2020 paper in the journal Solar Physics. Not everyone accepts it--yet. If Solar Cycle 25 unfolds as McIntosh and Leamon predict, the Termination Event will have to be taken seriously.



Above: Predictions for Solar Cycle 25. Blue is the official prediction of a weak cycle. Red is a new prediction based on the Termination Event.


The basic idea is this: Solar Cycle 25 (SC25) started in Dec. 2019. However, old Solar Cycle 24 (SC24) refused to go away. It hung on for two more years, producing occasional old-cycle sunspots and clogging the sun's upper layers with its decaying magnetic field. During this time, the two cycles coexisted, SC25 struggling to break free while old SC24 held it back.

"Solar Cycle 24 was cramping Solar Cycle 25's style," says Leamon.

Researchers have long known that solar cycles can overlap. The twist added by McIntosh and Leamon is the realization that overlapping cycles can interact. This makes sense. In the early 20th century, George Ellery Hale discovered that the magnetic polarity of sunspot pairs reverses itself from one cycle to the next; indeed, the sun's entire global magnetic field flips every ~11 years. When adjacent, opposite-polarity solar cycles overlap, they naturally interfere.

Termination Events mark the end of interference, when a new cycle can break free of the old.

The timing of the Termination Event can predict the intensity of the new cycle. In their Solar Physics paper, McIntosh and Leamon looked back over 270 years of sunspot data and found that Termination Events happen every 10 to 15 years.

"We noticed that the longer the time between terminators, the weaker the next cycle would be," explains Leamon. "Conversely, the shorter the time between terminators, the stronger the next solar cycle would be."


So when did the latest Termination Event happen? Dec. 2021. This yields a specific, testable prediction for Solar Cycle 25.

"We have finalized our forecast of SC25's amplitude," says McIntosh. "It will be just above the historical average with a monthly smoothed sunspot number of 190 ± 20 ."

"Above average" may not sound exciting, but this is in fact a sharp departure from NOAA's official forecast of a weak solar cycle. It could be just enough to catapult Terminators into the forefront of solar cycle prediction techniques. Stay tuned.

Editors note: Let's keep our fingers crossed for a stronger cycle than previously predicted.

Without the help from the amateur radio community, the above calendar would not have been possible.


